I'd like to remind parents and carers of the importance of attending school each and every day. Research has shown that missing school can have a negative impact on children's learning.

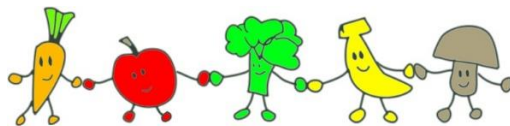
Please be reminded to look out for the special acknowledgement of achievement postcards that children receive for fantastic learning and behaviour; these are posted out every Friday afternoon.
