English/Literacy

In Literacy, pupils will read the novel 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo. This text will be used as inspiration for creative writing across a variety of genres including: character descriptions, persuasive texts, diary entries and recounts. Whilst reading this book, pupils will learn to make inferences and to understand characterisation.

Pupils will be taught spelling daily through the Read Write Inc Spelling scheme. They will learn the following sounds/spelling patterns:

- Using the silent letters b and t
- Words ending in 'ible' and 'able'
- Words ending in 'ent'
- Words ending in 'ence'

Pupils will be taught about grammar and punctuation through writing activities and have a 10 minute SPAG test each week.

Mathematics

Pupils will be consolidating and extending their understanding of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division during the first half term. They will also be consolidating written methods of all four operations. There will also be a key emphasis on understanding how to use fractions, decimals and percentages. The children will need to continue to revise and extend their number knowledge (decimal and negative numbers, percentage and fraction), times tables and division facts. There will be a focus on reasoning and problem solving skills and pupils will be taught how to apply their knowledge of methods taught to missing number, inverse and worded problems.

Science

The science topic for this half term is 'Living Things and Their Habitats'. Pupils will be taught:

- To describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including micro-organisms, plants and animals
- Give reasons for classifying plants and animals based on specific characteristics

PE

Each week all classes will have an indoor and outdoor P.E. session. During outdoor sessions pupils will be learning a range of invasion games and refining their passing, shooting and defending skills.

During indoor PE sessions, pupils will practise how to balance in a variety of ways.

International Primary Curriculum (IPC)

The first IPC topic for the year is called 'The Great, The Bold And The Brave'. During this unit, pupils will learn about the Greek classical civilization. Pupils will learn about the political systems of Athens and Sparta, making comparisons between the two. They will also learn about the Persian wars and the impact these had on Greece. They will research key historical figures, such as Alexander the Great. Pupils will also learn about the origins of the Olympic games and about Athenian life by studying the Parthenon.

This unit will be linked to art and pupils will also make their own pottery, based on their designs, which they sketched during transition week at the end of Year 5.

Computing

In computing this term the children will continue to use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour; identify a range of ways to report concerns about content. They will use a variety of research tools and Apps to support their learning in IPC, Literacy and Maths. Pupils will have access to coding programs to create and de-bug algorithms.

Please ensure your child is frequently accessing the Home Learning Zone via the school website at least three times a week.
